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SUPERVISED RELEASE

Upon release from imprisonment, the defendant shall be on supervised release for a term of:

STANDARD CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

- 1) The defendant shall not leave the judicial district without the permission of the court or probation officer:
- 2) The defendant shall report to the probation officer in a manner and frequency directed by the court or probation officer;
- 3) The defendant shall answer truthfully all inquiries by the probation officer and follow the instructions of the probation officer;
- 4) The defendant shall work regularly at a lawful occupation, unless excused by the probation officer for schooling, training, medical or physical limitations, or other acceptable reasons;
- 5) The defendant shall notify the probation officer at least ten days prior to any change in residence or employment;
- 6) The defendant shall refrain from Excessive use of alcohol and shall not purchase, possess, use, distribute, or administer any controlled substance or any paraphernalia related to any controlled substances, except as prescribed by a physician;
- 7) The defendant shall not knowingly frequent places where controlled substances are illegally sold, used, distributed, or administered;
- 8) The defendant shall not knowingly associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity and shall not knowingly associate with any person convicted of a felony, unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer;
- 9) The defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit him or her at any time at home or elsewhere and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view of the probation officer;
- 10) The defendant shall notify the probation officer within seventy-two hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer;
- 11) The defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the court; and
- 12) as directed by the probation officer, the defendant shall notify third parties of risks that may be occasioned by the defend ant's criminal record or personal history or characteristics and shall permit the probation officer to make such notifications and to confirm the defendant's compliance with such notification requirement.

You shall not operate a business or obtain employment at any place where you will be involved in the management or handling of cash, credit, or any other financial instruments, including cyber-based currency, without prior approval of the U.S. Probation Office and without disclosing information regarding the federal conviction to the employer.
